FORMER COACH INSPIRES TEAM SUCCESS & NEXT GENERATION OF WF JUDGES BY AMANDA VASAS

n the seven years Tom Bojanski, of Durham, North Carolina, coached the "Quest Homeschoolers," the team reached State Finals seven times and World Finals four times - placing third, eighth, fourth and third.

"What always excited me about Odyssey of the Mind is its platform to develop life skills in a safe environment," said Bojanski. "I tried to focus on how to be creative, work together in a team environment, listen, encourage one another and work through conflicts."

His coaching approach not only paid off during team performances, its positive effects continue as the Quest Homeschoolers do phenomenal work for the organization as Odyssey alumni. This year, five of the former team members, along with Bojanski and his wife, Nikki, are judging at World Finals!

With Odyssey celebrating its 40th anniversary, the Quest Homeschoolers alumni officials say that while outstanding team creativity hasn't changed, the use of technology in problem-solving has. From social media and 3D-printing to coding, these WF judges say technology is just one of the ways teams today take their performances to a whole new level.

"Instead of playing it safe, a lot of teams have embraced taking more risks," said Daniel Stickel. "I think the solutions have been equally creative over the years, but Odyssey has started to reward the risk-taking aspects of the performance more."

Those unknown factors can make it scary and stressful, but this team had it handled. Their key to success is practice and teamwork.



Since the team has been practicing since September, Taylor Netro said, "We have a lot of fun with spontaneous."

Brayden Chiusano said, "Competing in spontaneous has been very stressful, but since we have practiced, it has made it seem easier and less stressful." One of their coaches, Tondi Terhaar, believes that practice has made the team more mentally ready to receive the problems.

Braedon Bautista says, "When practicing we tried to make more creative responses, and the coaches gave us harder problems."

To take away some of the unknown, the team plans what they can. For example, this team has a set order for responding. Gabrielle Johnson explained the technique that they use for answering, "We pick the order we will respond ahead of time to avoid confusion during the competition."

To remove the unknown of the judging process, Janet Whittle explained, "To understand what the judges will be like, we judge each other." Abigail Hackl added, "By judging, we realized when we weren't following the directions."
