FIRST WAYNE KEHRLI MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP AWARDED

he first recipient of the Wayne Kehrli scholarship was awarded at the 2016 World Finals. Kenzie VanDerwerker participated in Problem 2: Something Fishy and was a member of Odyssey Angels. She is a second year graduate student at Radford University studying to become a Speech and Language Pathologist.

In her essay submission for the scholarship Kenzie wrote, "The organizational tasks and problem-solving skills I have learned in Odyssey have highly influenced my career goal of becoming a speech-language pathologist for children. I love the idea of working towards a goal and taking creative approaches to make a task more fun to address the communication needs of children - and these are all ideas that are part of the Odyssey of the Mind program. And the good news is – I know how to organize to help the children reach their goals!"

With over 18 years of experience in the program, Kenzie has been on numerous teams, won various awards over the years including Ranatra Fusca and OMER's Awards. Not only has she been on teams, but she has coached, volunteered at tournaments and participated in the Odyssey Angels program.

In Kenzie's letter of recommendation, her coach wrote, "I've coached her every year since kindergarten and have watched her embrace the challenges of Odyssey itself and take the skills she learned and honed in Odyssey into the rest of her life. Her greatest contribution to the team and to Odyssey of the Mind overall is her deep enthusiasm and commitment to the program."



With her love of creative problem-solving and desire to help others express themselves, Wayne Kehrli would be proud as she represents what he stood for in the program.

Wayne was involved with Odyssey of the Mind for 34 years beginning as a volunteer coach and judge, rising to International Problem Captain for Problem 1 Vehicles. He held this position for 25 years until his retirement in 2014 due to illness. He was honored with the OotM Spirit Award in 2007. Wayne believed creativity was everywhere, in every Odyssey problem solution, study and vocation. He loved seeing participants grow and change during their Odyssey experience.

The best way to honor Wayne is to continue what he dedicated much of his life to - encouraging creativity and education. This scholarship was established for a Division IV team member displaying the passion, creativity and growth Wayne so greatly encouraged and admired.

To be considered for the \$1,111 scholarship, team members must be a current Division IV competitor, enrolled at a college, university or technical school and be in good academic standing. Scholarship applications are in World Finals registration packets for every Division IV team member and the scholarship is awarded at the World Finals Awards Ceremony.

Problem Clarifications Reminder

Continue to stay up-to-date throughout the year and submit clarifications by visiting: www.odysseyofthemind.com/clarifications

Remember: The problem clarification system is not intended to replace reading the problem and the program guide. Please reread both before submitting a clarification. The deadline for submitting a clarification is February 15, 2017. Please continue to check clarifications after the deadline and until your tournament.

Do not submit a clarification that asks: (1) if an idea is creative or if one idea would receive more score than another. (No comment regarding subjective scoring will be provided); (2) where the judges or the audience will be during the performance (that is a question for your Tournament Director); (3) to confirm the wording of the problem; (4) if something may be different from an aspect that is specifically required (for example, if the problem requires 1/8" wood for a part, you are not allowed to use 1/16" wood for that required part).



ART INSTALLATION INSPIRATION Albert C. Barnes, 1872 - 1951

hemist turned art collector, Dr. Albert Barnes is known for his vast collection of art, but also his unique vision for how to share it with the world. He created his own unconventional way of displaying art and believed it should benefit students first. To help in his aims he founded The Barnes Foundation to "promote the advancement of education and the appreciation of the fine arts and horticulture."

Barnes came from a working class family from Philadelphia. He went to the University of Pennsylvania for his medical degree, earning his way by tutoring, boxing, and playing semi-professional baseball. He was a doctor by age 20. He then traveled to Germany to study physiological chemistry and pharmaceutics.

By 1901 he was back in the states and developed an antiseptic compound used to prevent infant blindness. He started his own business in 1908 and because of the effectiveness of the drug he created and the way he marketed it, his business boomed. As his interest in art grew, he sold his business for a reported \$6 million. The move was fortunate and well timed, as he sold just before the 1929 stock market crash and the discovery of antibiotics, which replaced his drug completely.

Barnes began to use his new wealth to study and acquire art. He is quoted as saying, "Living with and studying good paintings offers greater interest, variety and satisfaction than any other pleasure known to man." He spent years acquiring art and traveling to

France to meet many great artists of the time. The combination of his money, eye for art, and the poor economic conditions of the time, Barnes was able to acquire a great deal of important art at bargain prices. His 2,500 collection includes 69 Cézannes — more than in all the museums in Paris — as well as many Matisses, Picassos, Renoirs and many more major works of the time.

In 1922, Barnes created a foundation to display his collection, not for the benefit of art historians, but to inspire students and future artists. Viewings were made by appointment, and he always gave preference to those studying art. The way he displayed the art was considered outlandish at the time, but is now widely accepted. Barnes hung the collection according to his own ideas about showing relationships between paintings and objects.

Paintings of various styles were mixed together and placed near furniture, ancient artifacts, and finely crafted work from all different time periods — medieval times, the Renaissance, and Early American. For example, a room may feature various hinges and metalwork from different eras and cultures, a historic piece of furniture, and a variety of painting styles. This mixing together of objects and art from different cultures, time periods and media completely ignored traditional ways art was typically displayed — chronologically by type and year. He gave objects new meanings by how they were placed simply by changing what's around them. Also, very different from museums of the time, he gave little information about the pieces so the viewer could draw his or her own conclusions.

Barnes was also a prolific writer whose publications include six books about art and education. The Foundation still exists to-day. It has moved locations, but the rooms and art placement were duplicated exactly as Barnes originally intended. The collection, philosophy and display continues to inspire our future artists from all around the world.

Odyssey Angels: The Final Step

he response to the Odyssey Angels program has grown even more as it enters its 6th year. Creative ideas have been explored, friendships forged, and many lives and neighborhoods will be improved. There were a lot of great ideas presented during this year's Odyssey Angel enrollment.

Groups from around the world are participating -- from India, Indonesia, the U.S. and beyond. They are helping kids with disabilities, struggling families, building community gardens, and more. We consider everyone a hero that chose to enroll and help their community. One of the outstanding groups will be selected to attend World Finals. Here are the next steps to completing the Odyssey Angel program for this year.

If you have enrolled in the program by completing the online enrollment form, you will be sent a follow-up email that contains the "Progress Report" form for your group.

A representative can fill it out and return it any time before the April 1st deadline. You must return it by this time in order to be eligible to attend World Finals where you can present your proj-

ect. It simply asks you to update us on your project. We require a reference from the community member(s) you are helping. Keep in mind that your project can be ongoing. You don't have to stop because of the deadline.

Also, remember that you do not have to fill out the form as soon as you receive it. You should send it when you feel it is the best time to have your work evaluated, as long as it is submitted before April 1st.

Then, the Odyssey Angels panel will have the difficult task of selecting just one group to attend World Finals to represent the Angels. This group will by notified by Odyssey Angels Director Cheryl Micklus and the results will be posted to the Odyssey Angels web site.

There are so many generous and creative entries that although only one group can present at World Finals, many communities around the world benefit — they are the true winners!

Again, we thank the groups for their hard work and look forward to reading about all the good that has been done in those progress reports!


COACH PIN: comes in a fun green and black design letting everyone know that you were well trained by a very wise coach. Pin is 1 1½" \$4
