here are now multiple opportunities to experience worldwide creativity, experience different cultures, and create new and lasting friendships through Odyssey of the Mind. This year there are three festivals around the globe celebrating Odyssey of the Mind and creative problem-solving!

The first and oldest is Eurofest, to be held April 27 – May 2 in Germany. Perfectly situated within a biosphere reserve on the banks of Lake Werbellin, Eurofest will be held at one of the largest youth camps: the EJB Werbellinsee. This exciting event will bring over 1,000 creative minds together from 16 different countries. This will be the 26th festival held.

It is an annual showcase of solutions by teams from across Europe and beyond. It is not a typical tournament, but a fun-filled festival where attendees show off their long-term solutions, practice spontaneous and make new friends from around the world. It's a true celebration of camaraderie and creativity!

odyssey Around the World Countries participating include Germany, France, Switzerland, Poland, Russia, Moldova, Ukraine, Hungary, Czech Republic, Romania, Kazakhstan, China, India, Togo, USA, and Slovakia. And the third celebration of creativity around the world is the Asia Pacific Festival to be held in Shanghai, the largest city in China, from August 10-15. At this festival members from China and different countries will be mixed to form new teams to complete Odyssey challenges. There will be a problem released on site, with vouchers for teams to "buy" materials to use in solutions. All props will be made on site. There will be one mini long-term problem - the newly formed teams will have two and a half days to solve it. On the final day teams will show off their solutions. There will also be three

spontaneous problems on competition day. Of course, there will be a carnival where teams can experience traditional Chinese experiences such as calligraphy, painting, Tai Chi, tea ceremonies, and more. For more infomation email: omchina@163.com.

Problem Clarifications Reminder

Continue to stay up-to-date throughout the year and submit clarifications by visiting: www.odysseyofthemind.com/clarifications

Remember: The problem clarification system is not intended to replace reading the problem and the program guide. Please reread both before submitting a clarification. The deadline for submitting a clarification is February 15, 2018. Please continue to check clarifications after the deadline and until your tournament.

Do not submit a clarification that asks: (1) if an idea is creative or if one idea would receive more score than another. (No comment regarding subjective scoring will be provided); (2) where the judges or the audience will be during the performance (that is a question for your Tournament Director); (3) to confirm the wording of the problem; (4) if something may be different from an aspect that is specifically required (for example, if the problem requires 1/8" wood for a part, you are not allowed to use 1/16" wood for that required part).

FAMOUS, BUT NOT FORGOTTEN INVENTOR Hedy Lamarr, 1914 – 2000

he ability to see not-so-obvious connections often leads inventors to that "lightbulb moment" that becomes the beginning of an invention. This is exactly how the basis for wireless communication came about – the combination of player pianos and radio waves! The idea behind this technology was created by a renowned film star, actress Hedy Lamarr. Although Lamarr was famous on screen, her true interest was invention. She held several patents, but her call to fame in the scientific community is with spread-spectrum technology – the basis for wireless communication between devices.

Hedwig Eva Maria Kiesler was an Austrian-born American film actress and inventor who wanted to make a difference in her new country during World War II. She had an idea of creating a radio guidance system that used frequency-hopping technology that could not be tracked or jammed. After meeting George Antheil, a composer and pianist, the two began to brainstorm a way to make her idea a reality – and it was Antheil's knowledge of player pianos that lit the spark.

While a message was being sent, both the transmitter and the receiver would simultaneously change radio frequencies according to a special code. At each end of the transmission, identical slotted paper rolls, like those used on player pianos, sent the code according to a pattern of slots. Just as a player piano held and

changed notes at different times to make a melody, their invention held and changed radio frequencies to make an unbreakable code.

With an inventive mind that thrived on problem-solving, actress Lamarr shared the habits of creative thinking that we recognize in inventors. Her biographer Richard Rhodes confirmed that Lamarr "invented to challenge and amuse herself and to bring order to a world she thought chaotic."

Lamar was seriously considering quitting acting and going to Washington, D.C. to offer her services to the newly established Inventors' Council, but instead became involved in creating the device with Antheil. The two received a patent on August 11, 1942, for their invention of a classified communication system that would be beneficial for communicating on submarines.

She donated the patent to the US Military in hopes they would adopt the technology. The US Navy did eventually use it in the 1960s, but it was after the patent had expired. The inventors were forgotten for a time, but did get recognition more recently as their work became the basis for much modern technology.

Since Lamarr and Antheil's groundbreaking work in frequency hopping, many other applications of spread spectrum technology—the general term for wireless communications using variable signals—have arisen, including Bluetooth, wi-fi, and GPS.

This work led to their eventual induction into the **National Inventors Hall of Fame** in 2014. They also received several awards including the 1997 **Pioneer Award** from the Electronic Frontier Foundation for contributions to the wireless communication field, and the **Bulbie Gnass Spirit of Achievement Bronze Award**, given to individuals whose creative lifetime achievements in the arts, sciences, business, or invention fields have significantly contributed to society.

So while the star was in and out of the spotlight during her lifetime, her role in how we communicate today is ever-present.

Odyssey Angels: The Final Step

he response to the Odyssey Angels program has grown even more as it enters its 6th year. Creative ideas have been explored, friendships forged, and many lives and neighborhoods improved. There were a lot of great ideas presented during this year's Odyssey Angel enrollment.

Groups from around the world are participating -- from India, Indonesia, the U.S. and beyond. They are helping kids with disabilities, struggling families, building community gardens, and more. We consider everyone an angel that chose to enroll and help their community. One of the outstanding groups will be selected to attend World Finals. Here are the next steps to completing the Odyssey Angel program for this year.

If you have enrolled in the program by completing the online enrollment form, you will be sent a follow-up email that contains the "Progress Report" form for your group.

A representative can fill it out and return it any time before the April 1st deadline. You must return it by this time in order to be eligible to attend World Finals where you can present your proj-

ect. It simply asks you to update us on your project. We require a reference from the community member(s) you are helping. Keep in mind that your project can be ongoing. You don't have to stop because of the deadline.

Also, remember that you do not have to fill out the form as soon as you receive it. You should send it when you feel it is the best time to have your work evaluated, as long as it is submitted before April 1st.

Then, the Odyssey Angels panel will have the difficult task of selecting just one group to attend World Finals to represent the Angels. This group will by notified by Odyssey Angels Director Cheryl Micklus and the results will be posted to the Odyssey Angels web site.

There are so many generous and creative entries! Although only one group can present at World Finals, many communities around the world benefit — they are the true winners!

Again, we thank the groups for their hard work and look forward to reading about all the good that has been done in those progress reports!
